

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Definitions

Dropout rate by grade: Proportion of pupils from a cohort enrolled in a given grade at a given school year that is no longer enrolled in the following school year.

1. To measure the phenomenon of pupils from a cohort leaving school without completion, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. In addition, it is one of the key indicators for analysing and projecting pupil flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle.

Pupil-teacher ratio: Average number of pupils (students) per teacher at a specific level of education in a given school year.

2. To measure the level of human resources input in terms of the number of teachers in relation to the size of the pupil population. The results can be compared with established national norms on the number of pupils per teacher.

Repetition rate by grade: Proportion of pupils from a cohort enrolled in a given grade at a given school year who studies in the same grade in the following school year.

3. To measure the rate at which pupils from a cohort repeat a grade, and its effect on the internal efficiency of educational systems. In addition, it is one of the key indicators for analysing and projecting pupil flows from grade to grade within the educational cycle.

This is the fifth production of Enugu State Annual School Census (ASC) Report. This edition has greatly improved comparatively over the past four years, especially in the area of data collection at public secondary schools and private schools. It is a thing of joy to note that the quality of data collected in this version is credible and reliable and compliant to the National EMIS Policy and its implementation.

The timely introduction of the policy to have officials from the Post Primary School Management Board (PPSMB) and Science, Technical and Vocational Schools Management Board (STVSMB) manage the enumeration of secondary schools under them helped to improve the quality of data returned for analysis. The concentration of Inspectors of Education of Ministry, with the enumeration of private schools also enhanced quality of the data collected..

It is also interesting to mention here that the State EMIS is moving fast to another level – Integrated EMIS where the existing database is linked with those of the databases of LGAs. It is expected that in the near future, the LGAs databases will be functional, resulting in an integrated education database which will contain reports from Quality Assurance, School Support Officers, Social Mobilization Officers.

Another key improvement on this report is the inclusion of vital information on key performance indicators (KPIs) in the education Sector. This information will guide managers to take accurate and effective decisions.

We sincerely thank DFID- Education Sector Support Programme In Nigeria (ESSPIN) for all their support to bring the Ministry to this level of achievement. Mention must be made about the Planing, Research and Statistics Department, State Education Management Information System (SEMIS) Team and the entire Ministry of Education personnel who had worked tirelessly to produce this document.

Executive Summary

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The 2013/2014 Annual School Census report in Enugu State reflects a more stabilized approach in the conduct of a systematic data gathering, analyzing and reporting processes. It is the fifth attempt that consolidates some result-oriented strategies which ultimately make the outcomes more credible, reliable and usable for educational development planning and research. What seems more rewarding is the fact that data collectors and managers have continued to build more confidence in their experience and ability to do the right with minimal supervision.

Enumeration of schools within the period being reported witnessed 100% coverage of public primary and secondary schools. A total of 1,223 public primary schools were enumerated as opposed to 1,218 of the previous year which is an inclusion of 5 additional new primary schools. A total of 314 public secondary schools were enumerated indicating an increase of 9 new schools over the 305 schools covered in the previous year. Private school coverage has increased from 1,162 schools covered in the previous year to 1,382 schools.

What is really disturbing is the significant drop in public primary enrolment in the past three years. Public primary enrolment for Y2013/14 is 187,495 reflecting a drop of 3.8% from the Y2012/13 enrolment of 194,836. The enrolment dropped by 18.6% in Y2012/13 from the Y2011/12 enrolment of 239,245. Public secondary enrolment for Y2013/14 is 177,375 representing a drop of 0.1% from Y2012/13 enrolment of 177,514. The secondary school enrolment equally dropped by 26.2% in Y2012/13 from the enrolment of 240,237 in Y2011/12.

Table 4.2 indicates that there are 10,806 public primary teachers, a drop of 17.9% from 13,146 in Y2012/13. The recruitment of new teachers by the state government in Y2012/13 accounted for the 13.9% increase in the number of teachers over Y2011/12 figure. What is really amazing is this sharp drop of 17.9% in Y2013/14 which may be considered too high to probably represent retirees, disengaged and deaths. Pupil-teacher ratio for primary also decreased from 27 in Y2011/12 to15 in Y2012/13 and 16 in. For public secondary schools, the number of teachers for Y2013/14 was 11,873 indicating a decrease of 3.9% from 12,347 in Y2012/13. Pupil-teacher ratio in secondary schools for Y2011/12, Y2012/13 and Y2013/14 were 27, 14 and 15 respectively.

For public facilities Tables 5.3 and 5.4 indicate that there are 7,015 classrooms for primary and 4,063 classrooms for secondary schools as against 6,906 in Y2012/13 and 6,707 in Y2011/12 for primary. Likewise, Public primary pupils-classroom ratio for Y2013/14 is 158 as against 134 and 165 in Y2012/13 and Y2011/12 respectively. For public secondary, students-classroom ratio is 144 in Y2013/14, 232 in Y2012/13 and 242 in Y2011/12. The ratio distribution suggests that some classrooms may have been repaired or new ones constructed hence the sharp drop between Y2012/13 and Y2013/14. The same tables indicate that 80% of the schools have insufficient seating. Tables 5.7 and 5.8 indicate Pupil-toilet ratio of 152 and 155 in public primary and secondary schools respectively. The same tables equally indicate that 64.6% of the primary schools and 51.6% the secondary schools have no toilet. Tables 5.5 and 5.6 indicate that 87.4% of the primary schools and 83.3% of the secondary schools have no source of water respectively.

There have been a number of challenges surrounding this level of success; however, conduct of annual school census in Enugu State is becoming more stable by the years. Policy makers, researchers and other users are building more confidence and credibility in the outputs.

Chapter One

Background

It is worth sharing the experience that the outcome of the conduct of Annual School Census (ASC) in Enugu State is becoming more interesting, realistic and credible. This cannot be distanced from the fact that all the team players are getting more accustomed to the rules of the game especially in data collection processes, collation, entry, analysis and reporting. Due to regular training and retraining programmes for data collectors and State Education Management Information System (SEMIS) team with the support of DFID funded ESSPIN, data quality has continued to improve since 2009. It is a reflection of the mastery of the techniques and clear demonstration of immeasurable importance attached to education data as the basis for educational development planning.

The ASC is a statutory requirement of government that school data are collected from all public and private primary and secondary schools in the state. Report of findings from ASC analysed data reduces the tendency for arguments and doubts on the state of schools at the planning table. Before 2009/10 data on enrolments were collected at MDA levels, and data are at variance at different levels. The effort to centralise data has lead to the continual strengthening of the State Education Management Information System (EMIS) team members to collate, analyse and develop annual school census report. In the last four years the number of public and private primary schools has continued to vary. In 2009/10 1,118 public primary schools were enumerated and the number has fluctuated between 1,214 in 2010/11 and 1,221 in 2011/12. In 2012/13, a total of 1,219 schools were enumerated with slight increase to 1,223 in 2012/13. The enumeration of private schools has continue to increase from 75 in 2009/10 to 749 in 2010/11, in 2011/12 it increased to 1,079, also increased to 1,199 in 2012/13, and in the present ASC exercise it increased to 1,382, As the process improves and more awareness is created among stakeholders the interest in the the process of the development of ASC is also increasing.

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Chapter Two

Schools

Structurally, school can refere to a building where people, especially young ones receive education. Academically, it is an institution where learners receive formal education. It can also be described as a process of child's development educationally.

Each year, the Annual School Census is conducted to capture the state of public and private schools especially Pupils/Students, teachers, classrooms and other facilities so as to identify what should form the focus for educational planning.

For 2013/2014 year a total of 1,223 public primary schools were enumerated and all have pre-primary classes. A total of 1,382 private schools were enumerated this year while 1,199 were enumerated in 2012/13. The number of private schools enumerated has continued to increase this also means increase in school population.

Table 2.1 shows number of schools that responded and table 2.2 shows breakdown of private schools into school levels.

Chapter Three

Students

Students as used here include pupils in pre-primary and primary schools, and students in secondary schools. The data of pupils captured here include those in kindergarten and nursery which is the Early Child Care and Development Education (ECCDE). Table 2.3 summarised the enrolment of pupils and number of teachers by gender in all the public primary, junior and senior secondary schools. Of the 1,223 public primary schools enumerated, there are 256,340 pupils both at the pre-primary and primary school levels. Out of this number 131,348 are males while 125,027 are females. The Secondary Schools enumerated are 314 as against the 304 enumrated in 2012/13 with the gross enrolment of 167,003 students, as against 355,028 enrolment recorded in 2012/13. 

Figure 3.3. Chart showing enrolment of Public and Private Pre-Primary schools by LGEA




The chart above further shows Table 3.3 indicating that Enugu East LGA has the highest enrolment in private schools while Uzo-Uwani has the least.



Figure 3.7 Indicate % of Public and Private Primary Schools gross enrolment






Figure 3.9 shows Nsukka with the highest number Junior Secondary schools (32) and also the highest number of enrolment for boys and girls.

Fig 3.11 Chart showing public and private JSS enrolment






Figure 3.18 b. Shows the % of physically challenged pupils enrolled as against the% of total number of pupils enrolled in public primary schools



Chapter Four

Teachers

4.0 Introduction

The Total number of teachers in Pre-Primary and Primary schools are 12,567, with 11,983 for primary schools only. The Junior and Senior Secondary Schools teachers are 13,976 as against 12,347 in 2012/2013. There are 13,854 teachers in Pre-Primary and Primary as recorded in 2012/13. This means there is 10% drop in the number of teachers for primary schools in the State between the last and the present ASCs. Meanwhile there is 11% increase in the number of secondary school teachers in 2013/14.

Chapter Five

School Facilities

5.0 Introduction

Facilities here refer to Classrooms, Toilets, Blackboards and Water. For the 2013/2014 school census a total of 7,015 classrooms were recorded in public primary schools. Out of this number 56% is usable. For the public secondary schools a total of 4,167 classrooms were recorded out of which 57% is usable.

Pupil-Classroom-Ratio for primary is 66 while that of secondary is 75. At the primary level, 37.7% of the total classroom need major repairs, 80% does not have adequate seating, 68.1% has no good blackboard, 22% of the classes are held outside and 74.8% has no good health facility or first aid. At the secondary level, 20.5% of the classrooms are in need of major repairs, 80% has no adequate seating, 68.1% has no good blackboard, 22% of the classes are held outside and 50% has no good health facility or first aid.

For water situation at the primary level, only 3% of the total number of schools has access to pipe-borne water, 5.2% has access to borehole, 1% has access to well, 3.4% has other sources of water supply and 87.4% has no access to water. At the secondary level, 4.2% has access to pipe-borne water, 3.8% has access to borehole, 3.2% has access to well, 5.4% has other sources of water while 83.3% has no access to water.

For toilet situation at the primary level 64.6% of the schools has no toilet at all whereas 35.4% has at least one toilet. Pupil-Toilet-Ratio at the primary level is 152 pupils to 1 toilet. At the secondary level, 51.6% of the total number of schools has no toilet at all whereas 48.4% has at least one toilet. Pupil-Toilet-Ratio in the public secondary school is 155 students to 1 toilet.

The tables below show details of each indicator by LGAs and summaries at the state levels.



